

Though the different schools of Indian Philosophy present a diversity of view still there we see the common Stamp of an Indian culture. It is found that all the system regard Philosophy as a practical necessity and cultivate it in order to understand how life can be best led. The aim of philosophical wisdom is not merely the satisfaction of intellectual curiosity, but mainly to enlighten life led with insight. Every System except Carvaka, is moved to Speculation by a spiritual disquiet at the sight of the evils that cast a gloom over life in this world and it wants to understand the source of these evils and incidentally, the meaning of human life, in order to find some means to overcome the miseries of life completely. Indian Philosophers have shown us how to improve our moral life. For example, in Jaina Philosophy there is only one fundamental five-fold spiritual discipline. These are a) ahimsa b) satya (c) astaya d) bramhacharya and (e) aparigraha

Indian Philosophy reminds us that to work for the fulfillment of own interest is not good work. An action is justified if it is conductive to universal welfare and happiness (vahujanahitiya vahujana sukhaya). The teaching of Indian Philosophy is 'tyaktena bhunjita.'

Line space: 1.5 spaces.

Margins: 1.5 inch (2.5cm) all sides, Justified.

Word limit: Maximum 300 words for abstract and maximum 5000 words for the full paper.
